Mick Harker, chairman of the Bridge Cottage Committee was joined by 2 young helpers to lower the capsule into place, where it will stay for the next 100 years. Theodore Stribley aged 6, a member of 4th Uckfield Beavers, Manitoba Colony was one of the children to assist with the burial. Theo's colony contributed a scarf and badges to the capsule. The time capsule contained letters, objects and drawing from 16 local schools and community organisations.



Chairman's Roundup

First of all I think I must look forward to next year, on 8 October 2018 when we celebrate 50 years since forming the Uckfield and District Preservation Society. It was formed as a Society to restore Nutley Windmill and the area covered by the old Uckfield Rural District Council. Since the Society formed, many of the villages have also formed their own societies. I like to think they were following our example. Although UDPS officially formed in October 1968, in the summer of that year Tony Turner, Ken Hamley, Tony Shaw and Roy Fuller were in consultation with Nutley Windmill's Owner Lady Castle Stuart regarding its restoration or at least emergency repairs. So, on the 12th May, during the 2018 National Mills Weekend we will actually be celebrating 50 years of caring for the mill!

In the early 1970s, UDPS were becoming concerned with the future of Bridge Cottage. East Sussex County Council had purchased it with the intention of demolishing it, so that the proposed link road could be constructed. Our Society led the fight against this happening and eventually we were successful. Over the next 30 years several attempts were

made to obtain funding to restore the cottage, but it was not until Mick Harker, John Carvey and their team put their enthusiasm and time into a fund raising effort that we were able to finally carry out the work needed. This year has seen the results, and Bridge Cottage has had a very good first year.

The restored Cottage, with its enthusiastic team and many new activities, is steadily becoming known as a beautiful building which can be put to many different uses.

Meanwhile, at Nutley Windmill, we have been carrying out extensive work to bring the mill to be at its best for next year celebrations thanks to the efforts of twenty volunteers and a welcome grant from Wealden District Council. In June, the importance of our mill was recognized by Royal Mail who brought out a series of postage stamps featuring Mills, with Nutley as one of the first class stamps. With the season of open Sundays now over for this year we are already planning next year, first Sunday on 25th March 2017, but we are still open on Wednesdays, unless it snows!
